

Registration and Eligibility

A. Registration

- The teams/institutions are required to provisionally register themselves for the competition.
- The final registration link and payment details will be sent to the teams/ institutions provisionally registered.
- The last date of registration will be 20th July, 2025.
- The fee for registration shall be Rs. 500 per team.
- Once deposited, the fee will be non-refundable.

B. Eligibility

- Open to: Students of All recognised schools in India or abroad are eligible to participate
- One School can send multiple teams.
- The first 32 teams to register will be eligible to participate in the competition



General Guidelines

A. Team Composition

- A team shall comprise of two speakers and a researcher.
- Two participants can also participate, Researcher is not mandatory.
- No change in team composition is allowed after registration.

B. Structure of the Competition

- Memorial Submission
- Preliminary Rounds
- Quarterfinals (if applicable)
- Semifinals
- Final Round

C. Moot Problem

- A legal problem/case based on one or more subjects (e.g., Constitutional Law, Criminal Law, Cyber Law).
- Date of Release of Problem will be notified to the teams who will register, and the problem will be sent to them on their registered email id.



Memorial Guidelines

- **One Memorial each for Petitioner and Respondent**
- **Format:**
 - Cover Page (Blue for Petitioner, Red for Respondent)
 - Table of Contents
 - List of Abbreviations
 - Index of Authorities
 - Statement of Jurisdiction
 - Statement of Facts (Not more than 2 pages)
 - Issues Raised
 - Summary of Arguments
 - Arguments Advanced (Max: 20 pages)
 - Prayer
- **Front Cover of Each Memorial should have the following Details:**
 - The Team Code on the upper right-hand corner followed by 'P' for Memorial on behalf of the Petitioner and 'R' on behalf of the Respondent (e.g. Team allotted code number 15 shall write '15P' on the top right-hand corner of the front cover of its Memorial for the Petitioner).

Memorial Guidelines

- The name and the year of the competition.
- The name of the case.
- The title of the document (i.e. 'Memorial on behalf of the Petitioner' or 'Memorial on behalf of the Respondent').
- **Font: Times New Roman, Size 12 (body), 10 (footnotes), (Justified)**
- **Spacing: 1.5 line (body), single (footnotes)**
- **Margins: 1 inch on all sides**
- **Footnotes: Bluebook 20th Edition or any Other Citation Style (but it should even throughout the memorial)**
- **Submission Deadline: Will be notified to the teams who will register with us and the same will be notified on their registered email id.**
- **There will be Penalty for Late Submission**

All disputes to be referred to the Moot Court Committee, whose decision shall be final and binding.



Oral Rounds

- Each team will argue both sides in preliminary rounds (if double-sided).
- Time Allocation:
 - Total Time: 30 minutes per team
 - Speaker 1: 12–15 min
 - Speaker 2: 12–15 min
 - Rebuttals: 3 min (Petitioner)
 - Sur-rebuttal: 1 min (Respondent)
- The researcher is not allowed to speak during rounds.
- Judges may extend or reduce time at their discretion.

Language

- The language used in the Moot Court Competition will be restricted strictly to English.
- The Memorial should be in English only.
- Use of vernacular languages is prohibited.

- Best Team
- Runner-Up Team
- Best Memorial (Petitioner/Respondent)
- Best Speaker
- Best Researcher
- Certificate of Participation to all



Code of Conduct

- The participating teams should strictly adhere to the following dress code when present in any courtroom/virtual courtroom during the competition:
- Girls: White salwar and kurta or white shirt and black trousers along with a black blazer and black shoes.
- Boys: White shirt, black trousers along with a black blazer, tie and black shoes
- If the school uniform is already white shirt and black blazer or similar, then cover the logo of the school as there should be no disclosure of the identity of your school.
- Anonymous participation: Teams must not disclose identity strictly in no manner whatsoever.
- Disclosure of identity will lead to immediate disqualification.
- No communication with opposing teams during rounds.
- Plagiarism in memorials will lead to disqualification.



- **Team Code**

- ·The participating teams will be allotted a Team Code after registration.
- ·Teams must not reveal their identity in any form.
- ·Names of the participants or the name of the institution of the participating teams must not appear on or within the Memoranda

- **Scouting**

- ·A team that commits scouting in any form shall be disqualified from the competition
- ·Team members or persons directly affiliated with any team may only attend preliminary rounds of their teams.
- ·Violation of this rule should be brought to the attention of the courtroom officers immediately.
- ·Team or any member of the team or the school/institution shall not give the virtual link to any other person. It shall lead to immediate disqualification.

- **Technical (Online)**

- Platform: Google Meet/MS Teams (will be notified a week prior to the competition)
- Stable internet is the team's responsibility.
- Screensharing of memorials not allowed unless permitted.
- Video must remain on throughout oral submissions.



Sample Moot Problem

Case: State of Innovia v. EcoCorp Ltd.


Facts: EcoCorp Ltd., a multinational corporation, is accused of violating environmental regulations by dumping hazardous waste into the Innovia River, causing significant ecological damage. The State of Innovia has filed a case against EcoCorp under the Environmental Protection Act, 1986, seeking penalties and restoration measures.

Issues:

- **Whether EcoCorp Ltd. is liable for environmental damage under the Environmental Protection Act, 1986?**
- **Whether the State of Innovia can claim punitive damages for ecological restoration?**

Note: Participants will receive a different and detailed moot problem upon registration.
